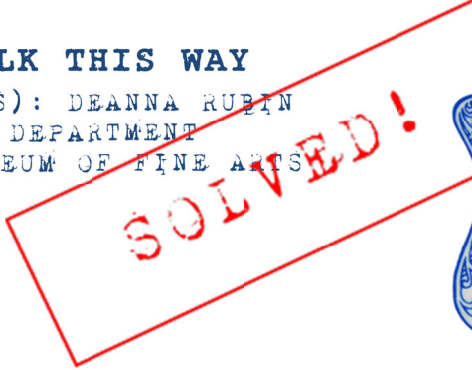


**CASE NAME: WALK THIS WAY**

**Answer:** TOMBS (or TOMB, and SAND gets some kind of “you’re close” response)

As clued in the flavor text, this puzzle is about a song. However, it’s not about the song in the title, but about a *different* way to walk. If you figure out enough of the pictures, especially the “O-face”, “way”, and “O magazine” next to each other in the top line, “Oh way Oh”, you may notice that all of the pictures in this grid represent words in the lyrics to Walk Like an Egyptian.

Each picture has a number, so indexing that number into that word gets you the following...
